President's Report

Peter Eagle

Over the last twelve months, I am confident in saying that the Men's Bowling Section has moved forward and dealt with a number of challenges and achieved success. I will reflect on these, however before doing so it is important that mention is made of the support that has been given to me by the Management Committee. Without their support and in some respects patience, nothing would be achieved. The positions on the Committee are voluntary and I would like to express my gratitude on a job well done.

During the year we have held an Open Day, won the Challenge Cup from Pennant Hills, won the Orange Blossom Festival Cup for the second year in a row, hosted Zone events such as the Presidents Singles and Pairs, the Metropolitan Senior Fours, a round of the Combined High Schools competition and run our own major and minor championships. As a section, we have sought and gained in principle approval to alter the bottom green from couch grass to Tifdwarf. Some of the gum trees on the western side of the top green have been removed or trimmed and shades replaced on the bottom green. Additionally, we have set in place a new fee structure. The Koala Carnival as well as the Turn Around Triples Carnival have also been successfully run as well as the Pennant programs. Social bowls have also taken place. Max Walters ran a very successful Twilight Bowls season which many bowlers attended and enjoyed. A number of bowlers also played in Zone events and were successful in reaching second or third rounds. West Pennant Hills' teams also participated in carnivals at other clubs and in some cases were successful in being winners or runners up. Also, Dallas Palm has completed a lot of work on the bowling sections website and Facebook. Dallas has committed himself to these projects. Regardless of what we may think of the electronic age unless we sell ourselves in the market place we will be left behind. Thank you Dallas for your effort and I hope you are in a position to continue with them into the future.

The *Koala News* has served members well in providing information on what has taken place around the club. It is not easy collecting information; therefore it rests upon all of us to participate. Ian Corke, John Skidmore and previously Don Carpenter have spent a lot of time and effort collecting material. I would like to thank them for the effort. It is important that the *Koala News* continues.

The new fee structure was born from a motion that was passed at the 2012 AGM. There was a lot of discussion on the topic with opinions for and against the motion. As the Committee that was formed to deal with the issue considered the options, it became apparent that here was a tool that if managed successfully could be an avenue to attract new members, whilst at the same time considering the position of the current members. After the support that was shown at a General Meeting and the approval given by the Sports Club Board, the new fee structure comes into place as from 1 January 2014. Bowling clubs need to be innovative and move with the times if they are to attract new members and this applies to West Pennant Hills. If clubs sit still and wait for something to happen they will disappear into the mists of time which is now happening. Tradition is important but traditions that may be important to current members may be a turn off for prospective new members. The Open Day was successful but needs to be run every two years so contact is maintained with the community. When we held the Open Day it was interesting to note the comments by some of those who attended that they were not aware of the Sports Club and subsequently joined. In essence, the bowling sections gained new members and the Sports Club gained new members.

The selectors as well as the bowls co-ordinator have had to deal with many issues and managed them very well over the course of the year. Max Walters and Kevin Tuckerman, who were both new to the managing of the positions, have done an excellent job. Unfortunately you are never going to please everybody. They have both tried very hard to make sure that bowlers are properly catered for during the year and programs and events run successfully. I would like to thank both of them and in the case of the selectors, thank you for the work and dedication that all of you have shown during the year. I would also like to add that selection modules run by the Royal New South Wales Men's Bowling Association have been attended by some of our selectors during the year. A selector needs to have a good grounding of what is required and further progress needs to take place.

Training and coaching have continued during the year. Warren Phillips and Michael Schwarcz have put a lot of time and effort into the program. We now have a camera which can be used to film bowlers to highlight errors that they may have in their bowling action. Some have welcomed this opportunity but there are many who have not taken the opportunity. One has to wonder why this is the case? To Warren and Michael, thank you for your commitment. To our other coaches, thank you for your efforts. Dallas Palm and Keith Robinson have re-accredited so we have a good body of coaches on hand to instruct bowlers at West Pennant Hills.

David Roles has been looking after the welfare issues of the bowlers. I would like to thank David for the time that he has taken on the matter. It is important that contact be maintained with the bowlers who are ill or are unable to attend so that they are not forgotten.

To our Zone 10 representatives, Michael Schwarcz, Warren Phillips, Les Watkins and Robert Cole, thank you for the time that you are giving to support the Zone. The positions at Zone are voluntary. Having to deal with the many differing opinions from all the clubs is not an easy task.

To the umpires, thank you for your support and to Don Couch thank you for the time that you have put into managing the umpires. There have been some interesting discussions on the rules which are very healthy as it shows differences of opinion do arise and need to be debated.

After the open day in 2012 the coaches have followed up 43 potential bowlers who indicated that they would like further instruction. Ten people plus another eight bowlers subsequent to the Open Day, came to further coaching and are now enjoying the game. We would like to thank all bowlers who assisted on the Open Day, especially our introductory coaches who had them bowling in no time.

The Coach's committee was able to purchase a Video Camera and TV screen with the help of the Sports Club providing the money. With this new equipment we were able to video 25 bowlers (men and women). Bowlers were able to see for themselves some of the issues they have with their bowling actions and delivery, with the coaches explaining their faults and providing suggestions to correct problems. Out of the 25 people who were videoed and were offered help from the coaches, only one person sought help whilst the others did it on their own and have returned to their observed faults. Whilst the video is a good tool in helping people to understand the cause of their inconsistencies, it is pretty useless when appropriate follow up exercises are not used.

The club did not continue the coaching and training program that was introduced in the previous year. It is hoped that in future years that committee and players have more involvement in coaching and training as it would enhance their bowling prowess and enjoyment.

Ken Wighton has been a coach for many years at West Pennant Hills and decided to not reaccredit as a coach. On behalf of the members and coaches of West Pennant Hills we would like to thank Ken Wighton for the assistance and coaching given to so many of our members in the pa

Last year (2012) was my first year as a Selector, and like most Committee type roles, it was a real learning curve.

After being elected Chairman this year, I now have a much greater appreciation of the Chairman's responsibilities with players making themselves unavailable at very short notice and the need for Team changes.

I believe that experience and our knowledge of WPH bowlers with a similar viewpoint, has enabled us to carry out our respective roles with the Club's best interest in mind.

Following the decision last year to focus on Grade 5, the Selectors and Management Committee agreed to revert back to selecting the best players in the top Grade.

Summary

The Club purchased a Video Camera during the Season and most of the players completed their taping and review with the Coaches, but again, there were very few players who did any of the training exercises, and few have sought follow up feedback from the Coaches.

You may recall that last year we commented on the number of players that participated in a Training session run by Michael Beaumont from the Royal.

Despite agreement by a large percentage of players to train and commit to the Pennant Season, the Club incurred an average of 7 players per week who were unavailable.

Regrettably, this year also saw a number of players who after advising of their availability to play Pennants, took holidays or weekends away.

Illness and unforeseen family issues are always inevitable, but with so many absences, team unity is difficult to maintain.

I don't want to dwell on the negatives. Clearly we will have a challenge next year. Do we have 2 or 3 Sides, and what grades should they be?

Challenges

Can we convince Grade 5 and above players from other clubs to join West Pennant Hills?

The Club will be undergoing extensions this year and we hope to have a new Tifdwarf Green installed by year's end.

Already we have had a couple of bowlers from Dural Country Club join us, one of whom is Gary Tyrrell who played all games in Grade 6, continues to improve and he is enjoying his bowls.

We had several players this year participate in the State, Seniors and President's events (Singles, Pairs, Triples and Fours).

Rod Gamble was Runner-Up in the Sectional Singles, and while our other players were not as successful, it was a good opportunity to promote West Pennant Hills Sports Club's Bowling Sections.

We need to implement a training program for each of the Teams.

We can't expect to turn up on Saturday and compete against stronger Clubs who not only have excess players to choose from, but their teams train on a regular basis.

RNSWBA and BA will continue to run Training Courses. Several WPH players have attended these Courses already, but they are available to anyone who is interested in improving their knowledge and understanding of the game.

- Selections (\$50.00 per person). This module is recommended for Selectors, particularly those involved in Pennant and Championship events.
- Competition (\$50.00 per person). This module is recommended for anyone participating in competitioin events, e.g. Pennants, Championships.

Conclusion

I believe that if we could convince several quality players to join WPH from other clubs, and commit to a regular training regime, we could be competitive against some of the bigger Clubs. A further incentive, particularly to those Pennant and regular bowlers, is the Board's approval to adopt a new Bowls Fee structure commencing next year. Several local Clubs have already

increased their Annual Fees and their Green Fees, making our Club a very viable option. Details are on the Bowls Web site.

Without these new players, and based on the current number of current WPH Pennant bowlers, it is difficult to see how we can maintain 3 Sides next Season.

So, if you know anyone looking for a change of Clubs, please speak to them or pass on their details to one of the Selectors.

Finally, I want to also thank Peter Eagle and Max Walters for their support during the year, the Selectors, Club Management and the Club's Board of Directors, and finally, you, the Bowlers.

Without your participation and commitment, both in Social and Pennant/Championship events, we would not continue to be the friendly and competitive club we are.

At the Umpires Panel annual meeting held 10th August, I was the only nomination for Chairman. I accepted the nomination and look forward to working with the panel as Chairman for the coming 12 months.

Greens

Within the last twelve months further improvements to the greens has taken place. The biggest improvement is on the top green with the removal of some gum trees and the trimming of others on the western side. Hornsby Council after inspecting the trees agreed that action was required and carried out the procedure without any cost to the Sports Club. The Sports Club was also able to purchase a second hand mower which has an attachment that can skim the surface of the green so gumnuts and twigs may be collected. This has been a constant problem in the past. The sprinkler system has been improved with the laying of a new water pipe so pressure can be maintained. Now that we have more sun light in the western corners of green, it is hoped the grass will grow and spread more easily. There is little doubt that the root system of the gum trees has restricted growth. There are signs this is taking place even during winter.

I would like to mention the work that has been undertaken by our green keeper, Steve Arhipo. Steve is very enthusiastic and he carries out his tasks without any prompting. The greens as well as the surrounds are always in good shape and quite a number of visiting bowlers have commented on these aspects. A good working relationship has developed and needs to be maintained.

We have obtained from the Board of the Sports Club, in principle approval to replace the grass on the bottom green with Tifdwarf grass. Without going into the specifics, Tifdwarf is a more compact grass, which allows a bowl to hold a more accurate line. The speed of the green in most cases is also faster. A lot of bowling clubs are now moving to Tifdwarf and it has been a matter that has been discussed at West Pennant Hills for some time. At this stage it is uncertain when the work will proceed, however it will be subject to the commencement of the Sports Club renovations. The bottom green does require some heavy maintenance and this will be completed at the same time.

Seven shades on the bottom green have been replaced. The others will be replaced in due course. The cost is a capital expense of the Sports Club and is not cheap. If the shades are looked after and taken down after use they should last for fourteen years. Unfortunately this is not always the case. There is a responsibility on both Bowling Sections to play their part. Some bowlers but not all are now getting the message. To those bowlers who take down the shades when they see that they have been left up, thank you for your assistance it is very much appreciated.

Mention has been made in previous reports about the drainage problems on the bottom green, especially in the northwest corner. During winter, the corner is constantly wet. With the installation of the Tifdwarf, the problem may be able to be rectified or be reduced.

Due to the improvements of the greens, West Pennant Hills was allocated rounds of the Zone 10 President Singles and Pairs. We were also allocated a round of the Metropolitan Zone Seniors Fours. This is the first time this club has been allocated a round in this event. It is felt the events were run successfully and hopefully we will be considered again in 2014. We also hosted one game in the Combined High Schools competition. The game was between Galston High School and Homebush Boys High School. It is an area that needs to be considered and enquiries made to see if West Pennant Hills is able to secure more games in this competition.

To the other members of the Greens Committee, Warren Phillips and Mathew Stubbs, thank you for your assistance. I feel that we can be proud in what has been achieved this year.

To the bowlers, your patience is appreciated. There have been times when the greens have been taken out of play so maintenance can be completed. This action has not pleased some bowlers but it is the long term condition of the greens which is the major factor and not the short term requirements that have to be considered.

Overall, progress has been made so happy bowling to all of our bowlers.

NOTES

- 1. Green Fees ended up below budget expectations but Fees & Expenses overall are lower
- 2. We had budgeted a loss of \$8,277 and when the Koala income is corrected we ended at a loss of \$9,909 which is a delta of \$1,632
- 3. There was 9 unplayable days due to rain and extreme heat with 3 x corporate days not being played
- 4. Raffles on the Saturday with 4 x trays has provided overall income of \$1,830
- 5. Koala Income shows \$3,464 in the June report but this figure should be \$4,455
- 6. TAT income. The 2012/2013 income and expenses will be allocated to the 2013/2014 budget. It was necessary to make an allocation in the 2012/2013 budget as at the time WPH was not aware of the schedule. In essence, there may be two TAT allocations for 2013/2014 if the WPH game falls within the current financial year.
- 7. Attached is the new Budget for 2013/2014 which includes the change to the Fee Structure. The new Fee Structure will come into force, for those that take it up, from the 1st January 2014. The Budget has taken into account an estimate to players taking on the New Structure.

The accounting procedures implemented late last financial year has proven beneficial as our tracking of revenue and expenses have been very accurate. This showed in the data entry error with the Koala Carnival income. This year involved more work developing the 2013/2014 Budget as there was a need to create one under the original fee structure and another with the new fee structure. At the time of creating the Budgets the Club Board had not approved the new fee structure. I'm delighted to see the new fee structure has been approved and would like to thank the whole sub-committee that worked on the proposal to the Board but especially Warren Phillips and Peter Eagle. Warren also gave me great assistance over the year to assist me with the Treasurer role, many thanks. On a closing note I would like to thank Peter Eagle for his role as Men's Bowls President for his time and effort in that role and wish him well as he stands down at the next election.
