

Bowling Sections such as ours rely heavily on volunteers and we are very fortunate to have such a willing and capable group of members to assist during the past year. I cannot thank them enough for their time and effort.

In terms of the key achievements of this year:

Pennants – 2015 was always going to be a challenging year following the great success we enjoyed last year. All grades performed admirably with our Grade 7 side the pick of the three. It was so pleasing to see some of our long term members acting as mentors to some of our newer bowlers in this grade. I have every confidence that 2016 will be a great season.

Competition Panel – I appreciate our Section was divided on the continuation of the Competition Panel this year. However, as I have said, the Selectors and Competition Panel work in unison, not as separate entities. I look forward to continuing with this next year.

Greens – Both greens have now been changed from Couch Grass to Tifdwarf, ensuring a better bowling surface on both greens. Our former green keeper Steve Arhipoff resigned to join his father on a building project. I would like to thank Steve for his efforts. We welcome Cameron McClure as our new greenkeeper in Steve's place. Cameron is a keen bowler and has been doing a great job with our greens under the watchful eye of our Greens Committee Chairman Peter Eagle. My thanks to you both.

Sponsorship – This year we were delighted to welcome on board Independent Gaming as our Major Sponsor. This three year sponsorship deal has afforded our Section's Koala Carnival greater security into the future. This year also saw Bill Austin and Homeway First National Real Estate end their long standing association with this event. I know all members join with me in thanking Bill for his many years of support.

Koala Carnival – This was a successful event with 24 teams entering and a new format ensuring prize money was shared more evenly across all participants.

Turn-Around Triples – Yet another successful event with 26 teams in attendance. There may be a move to change this format next year and we will know more after a meeting of the six clubs later this year.

Mixed Bowls – I believe the increase in mixed events over the past twelve months has been one of our greatest achievements. Our Mixed Championships have been well contested. We now run Mixed Bowls on a Saturday morning, getting more people on our greens. Our Christmas Party last year was a raging success, as was the Bunco Night held recently. We have also had a group of 'travelling bowlers' from both Sections visit Lemon Tree Passage last year and other group visiting Norfolk Island later this year. Thank you in particular to Max Walters and Jeremy Thiedeman for their work in this area.

During the year we reclaimed the Challenge Cup from Pennant Hills with home ground advantage assisting in our decisive victory. West Pennant Hills contested the Orange Blossom Festival Cup and were runners-up in the 2014 Hornsby Cup at Wisemans Ferry. We also hosted a round of the Combined High Schools competition and had a very successful Twilight Bowls season. My thanks to Max Walters and his team for once again showcasing our great game to many visitors during the summer months.

At the Zone level, West Pennant Hills has had a great year. Darrin Ede won the 2014 Zone 10 Rookies Singles Competition with Ross Fitzpatrick the runner-up. In the State Fours, we had two teams reach the sectional playoffs. In the President's Fours, West Pennant Hills were runners-up. Congratulations to the father and son combination of Jim Ede and Darrin Ede, who along with Dallas Palm and Michael Schwarcz shared this honour.

West Pennant Hills has continued a strong tradition of service to the Zone and to Bowls NSW. Les Watkins was elected Senior Vice President along with Michael Schwarcz who is Zone Secretary. Michael is also our Zone State Councillor and a member of the State Match Committee. Bob Cole continues his contribution to the Zone as a member of the Umpires Committee.

Thank you to the Board of Directors of the Sports Club, Jason Read and his team, and Peter, Tony and the restaurant staff. Your support over the last twelve months is valued and very much appreciated.

In closing, 2014-2015 has been a good year. I look forward to working with all members to make 2015-2016 a great year.

GREENS COMMITTEE REPORT

It is with pleasure that I present the greens report for the 2015 Annual General Meeting.

The opportunity arose in late 2014 to resurface the bottom green with Tifdwarf grass. During the course of the work, the green was lowered to regulation height and drainage requirements were considered. The green came back into play in late January 2015. For a new green it has performed very well, however it will take at least 18 months for the surface to settle.

The top green was resurfaced in 2014. It has settled in well, though we still have problems in the north west and south west corners with grass coverage. Clearly, the gum trees are the concern. It was decided to plant Bent grass in the corners to see if this would solve the problem. Unfortunately, the result was not successful. During the next maintenance period further consideration will be given to rectify the situation.

The northern section of the bottom green in winter suffers from continual dampness with the major cause being the height of the hedges. This stops sunlight reaching the area. Recently, the hedges were trimmed to fence height and there has been a noticeable improvement. I would like to thank the Sports Club management for their assistance.

A green keeper's job is not an easy one as there are bowlers who have different ideas on how the job should be undertaken. At times the comments are unfortunate without any thought given as to the reason why a decision has been taken to close a green or limit the amount of use on a particular green. Since April 2015 a lot of rain has fallen and the weather has been colder. Damage to the surface of the greens is hard to repair which has an impact during the course of the year. The green keeper at WPH has a lot of experience and the decisions made need to be respected. It is in the long term interest of all the bowlers that need to be considered not the short term interest.

To all the bowlers who have assisted during the year dealing with the small requirements such as bringing in the corner flags, closing the shades, setting out the mats and jacks, your contributions are always appreciated. I would also like to make a special thank you to Cliff Johnstone for his support. During the year, Cliff made new erasers for the score boards, refurbished old rink numbers for the bottom green so the green can be turned quickly and assisted bowlers in repairing broken or damaged equipment. It is the support of this nature that makes management of the greens a lot easier.

To the greens committee and the management of the Sports Club, thank you for the support that has been provided during the year. A lot of time and effort is put into keeping the greens in good condition which is done behind the scenes and forms part of the job. To the bowlers, thank you for your support and good bowling.
