## BOWLS COORDINATOR/MATCH COMMITTEE REPORT

2018 was not without the usual challenges keeping to our bowling schedule. This year the mid-week Pennants season was extended to 10 rounds and commencement of the weekend Pennants was delayed due to the Commonwealth Games. We have now managed to get back on track, and importantly completed the Major Pairs and Major Singles enabling the winners to enter the Zone Champion of Champions.

#### **Club Championships**

To date the following championships have been completed including the Major Singles and Major Pairs. Congratulations to the winners Darrin Ede, Dallas Palm and Ross Fitzpatrick and good luck in the Champion of Champions tournaments. The Minor Singles and Minor Pairs tournaments have been completed with the Club Triples, Club Fours still to be played, as are the Minor Pairs, Ken Wighton Singles and the Barry Walker Classic pairs.

#### **Mixed Events**

The Mixed Fours have been completed. The Mixed Triples is currently in progress, and the Mixed pairs will commence on the 31st July.

#### WPH v PH Challenge Cup

The WPH v PH Challenge was hosted by Pennant Hills on Friday 1st June with 7 teams from each club playing for the cup. WPH put up strong competition early in the game. However Pennant Hills were too strong and won with an overall margin of 20 shots. This was a huge improvement for WPH on the 2017 result. Although WPH lost, all players enjoyed the afternoon. Hopefully WPH will secure the cup in 2019.

#### • Presidents Singles

Chris Judkins did WPH Sports proud by winning the 2018 Zone President's Singles tournament by a convincing final score of 31 v 13. Congratulations Chris!

#### **Friday Mufti Pairs**

Friday Mufti Pairs participation has been weak this

season. However interest appears to be picking up. Hopefully the numbers will grow as we head into Spring and some warmer weather. The current format now consists of either 3 or 4 bowl pairs of 21 ends. The jackpot prize has been replaced by a random draw for a 'lucky' rink. All monies collected on the day are returned to winners of the 'lucky' rink draw.

#### Living Choice Triples (LCT)

This year the Turn-Around-Triples (TAT) was replaced with a new format. Significant changes included, inviting lady bowlers to the event and reducing the overall event time by playing two games of 12 ends. This is followed by lunch and winners presentation. This approach enables players to leave mid afternoon and avoid peak hour traffic.

WPH held their event on Monday 16th July. Unfortunately we only fielded 22 teams instead of the possible 28. There was only one team entered from Brush Park as most of their players attended a plaque unveiling commemorating West Epping Bowling club. Another factor was school holidays, as many players babysit their grandchildren. None the less, the event was a resounding success!

#### **Koala Carnival**

The 2018 Koala Carnival scheduled for the 7th May got off to a false start. The committee agreed to introduce a new format consisting of two games of 3 bowl Pairs by 12 ends, with a minimum combined entry grade of 11, which effectively prevented players in Pennants grades 1, 2 and 3 from playing in the Carnival. Subscription to the new format was extremely poor and plenty of feedback was received disapproving of the new format.

The Carnival has been rescheduled for Monday 27th August with a format consisting of two games of 11 ends, 3 Bowl Triples, and a minimum combined entry grade of 13. At the time of writing (21/07/18) we currently have 13 entries.

#### **Hornsby Shire Cup**

This event has been scheduled to be played at Asquith Bowling Club on Sunday 16th September. A total of 10 WPH Bowlers will be invited by the Selectors to represent WPH in one of the four disciplines, Singles, Pairs, Triples or Fours.

On Wed 11th July a meeting was held at Asquith Bowling club with representatives from

## GREENS REPORT

There have been some small improvements to some of the issues reported in last year's report. The standard of the green has disappointed members and guests throughout the year. Despite offers to host zone events from the club, the zone preferred to use greens at other clubs.

The green surrounds have better grass cover, during the year the club organised for a contractor to aerate the surrounds of the top green and more water was applied resulting in many of the bare patches being resolved. The plinth and backings have not yet been renovated. Despite repeated requests to the greenkeeper to address issues with the corner posts and boundary pegs, the problems have not been resolved.

Disappointingly, Green 1 consistently had cigarette butts on the surrounds of the green from non-members club patrons. Aerating the surrounds of the bottom green will be a recommendation given to the club.

#### Green 1

In the renovation at the end of 2017, the contractor

reports that he laser levelled the surface. The bare patches on the southeast corner were plugged, although the couch infestation was not addressed. Despite the work that was done in this renovation, the green surface continues to be inconsistent. The committee will be recommending that the surface be laser levelled again in the next renovation. The fungal infections and weeds in the grass continue to be a problem.

#### Green 2

Unfortunately, this green was not laser levelled in 2017 due to the extended but unscheduled length of time taken on the renovation of Green 1. The contractor has been unable to address the fungal infections in the grass. The bare areas on the western end are much improved but further work is required to obtain and maintain consistent grass cover.

The committee will continue to work with Proturf to ensure the greens are the best that they can be.

#### NOTES

1. The income and expenditure figures shown are complete as presented to the Board by the office.

2. As mentioned in last year's Finance Report by the then Treasurer, Ross Fitzpatrick, the categories of Green Fees, Sports Fees, Sports and Green Fees includes all membership subscriptions, match payments by members on the old fee structure and Friday payments. To simplify reporting to the office and for more accurate month end reports the Club has agreed to change to the current Budget categories which will be used for this current Financial Year.

3. Some income and expenditure items have been allocated to incorrect categories. The overall loss is the most relevant figure.

4. The original scheduled date for the Koala Carnival would have brought the income into 2017/2018 figures but the

Carnival has been rescheduled for August 2018.

5. Actual loss was higher than budget as there was no Koala Carnival income and lower Sports & Green Fees offset by budgeted Uniform purchases not occurring.

6. Sponsorship income is under budget as there seemed to have been some confusion in June 2017 that the Club Office was not instructed to invoice anyone for the Scoreboard Sponsorship. There was no income for Scoreboard Sponsorship in 2017/2018. In 2018/2019 there are steps to recover and start invoicing and attracting new sponsors as noted in the new Budget.

7. Overall loss made in 2017/2018 is \$5,800 higher than the budgeted loss of \$35,834 from the previous year's loss.
