March 2010 and Year to Date Financial Results:

Attached is a copy of the March 2010 accounts provided by the main club.

The month of March 2010 and Year to Date does however contain some errors which will need to be corrected next month. I have emailed the Club about the errors. The errors are Raffle Takings are understated by \$180.00, Other Income is overstated by \$420.00 and Green Fees are understated by \$240.00.

Month of March 2010:

- We lost two days bowling this month. This has had a \$600.00 approx adverse impact on our Green Fees.
- Raffle takings were also down by around \$300.00 approx due to the two lost days.
- Even with the two lost days green fees were again well up on budget.

- Greens Maintenance is well up on budget due the cost of plinths \$1,200.00 (this is 70% of the full cost of \$1,700.00). Are we sure this is a cost for us and not the Club?
- Other Costs in the month was the result of a Friday Jackpot of \$360.00.
- Catering Costs were the result of Pennant games at home.

Year to Date March 2010:

- The Loss Year to Date of \$3,480 compares favourably to a budget Loss of \$3,674.
- Sponsorship Income and Other Income remain an issue and was the subject of comments in previous month's reports.

Sponsorship:

Following is an update on the invoices we sent out mid January 2010 for last year's advertising:

- Jacobs Creek for signs \$1,000 plus GST. Not paid yet.
- Image Pools for signs on Green \$500 plus GST. Not paid yet.
- Independent gaming for signs \$500 plus GST. Club working on contra deal and will advise
- Cherrybrook Pharmacy for signs \$500 plus GST. Paid the full amount but 30% given to Ladies Club.
- Albert Meyer for signs \$250 plus GST. Not paid yet.

We need to consider our next steps with these companies. Perhaps our President should contact each of them to determine if there is a future with them advertising on our score boards.

I think the Management Committee needs to consider what would be a satisfactory minimum number or entries on each day in order to make the carnival viable. 5.10. Zone 10

At the time of writing this report, the Zone business papers for the May meeting have not arrived.

From the April meeting, the main points of interest are:

- WPH has indicated to Zone that we are interested in a Zone recruitment drive; however we require more details to be supplied. Nothing further has been received.
- Budget detail and fee increases for 2010/2011 have been advised. Details have been supplied to WPH treasurer, secretary and president.

- Approval for Artificial Devices has been clarified. Walking sticks do not require approval. An application to use a bowler's arm is required.
- WPH coaching details received from Zone (Harry Arthurs) and supplied to Bill Arnott for updating. A meeting for coaches was held at The Hills on 12 April re the new coaching requirements.
- A successful new umpire's course involving twenty two candidates has been completed. A further accreditation and re-accreditation course may be held in June 2010.
- A number of clubs have lost points for contravening clearance requirements. Clubs need to be careful about moving players up and down. The use of fill-ins may have them unfairly graded for next season. This always needs to be considered.

Three shades have been ordered at a cost of \$609.95, two will be used immediately and the 3rd kept for future replacement.

Planting of annuals on the Western side of the No1 green is in hand for a good showing in time for our Koala Carnival.
