- 4. The Club will not match our contribution to the Prostrate Cancer Foundation. I am waiting on the cheque for \$650 so that we can forward it on.

3.6 Bowls Coordinator

There are three matters that need the attention of the Management Committee at this June 2011 meeting. The matters in question are the Minor Championships, the Koala Carnival and the proposed 5 Aside carnival.

1. The Minor Triples Championship Nomination and Eligibility Form was displayed on the notice board for four weeks prior to the closure date for entries on Saturday the 28th May. It was disappointing that only two teams entered and therefore it was initially decided to cancel the event altogether. Subsequent to that decision, it has been decided to keep entries opened for another week as we now understand that some players were confused by the eligibility rules and thought themselves ineligible.

In my view the eligibility rules are clear and it's a matter of the players not bothering to read the Nomination Form correctly. Over the next few playing days I will endeavour to educate the members to seek the eligibility clarification from the Bowls Coordinator. If we can get six or more entries this week the event can still go ahead.

^{1.} Nominations Open 42 days prior to the date of the AGM - Simply post a 'Notice of Meeting' on the Notice Board in the Sports Room and have Nomination Forms available from the Secretary.

^{2.} The Administration will send out a Notice of Meeting to all Section Members at least 23 days prior to the AGM.

^{3.} The election is conducted at the AGM either by a show of hands or secret ballot - A brief Annual Report is generally handed out to Section Members at the Meeting.

For future reference may I suggest that all non Association Event are not to be conducted with less than six entries?

2. Koala Carnival – The first meeting of the joint Men's and Women's Koala Carnival Committee was held on Wednesday 1st June 2011. A list of "things to do" has been compiled and jobs allocated to members in the best position to perform those jobs. For information purposes I have attach a copy of that list. (Attachment A)

There are several matters that still need to be resolved;

- The Ladies have asked that the number of ends to be played in the mixed event be reduced from 19 to 17 ends. They say some of the ladies find it difficult to play 2 games of 19 ends. I would be happy to support their request.
- The entry fee Last year was \$60 per team or \$20 per player. Most of the carnivals are now \$25 per player but given that our three days will be late in the season I would be happy to see it remain and \$20 and possibly attract a full 28 teams. Whilst we would lose on the entry fees, the club would overall gain on the bar service and poker machine takings.
- What is the minimum number of team entries before we consider it not worth running any of the days or indeed the whole carnival?
- The Ladies wish to discuss further, the allocation of prize money. I have advised them that we can discuss this matter at an informal meeting during the course of the next week. This is especially so as they have asked that we have the Flyers ready for them to hand out on the 22nd June 2011.
- 3. This event has been rescheduled from Sunday 25th September to Sunday 28th August. As members would remember the change in dates was as a result of making way for the annual NSW Teachers versus the Queensland Teachers day.

In my view we haven't sufficient time to run the event just one week before the three day Koala Carnival and I recommend that we cancel the event for this 2011 year.
