# 1. Reports

#### 1.1 President

As we are now moving into the winter months, all bowlers need to be mindful of the condition of the greens and to protect them as much as possible. More has been said about this in the Greens Report.

The finals of the inaugural Ken Wighton Singles and the Minor Triples have been completed. Congratulations to Steve Brady in his win over Bob Cole in the Singles and to Steve Brady, John Skidmore and Norm Jackson over Kevin Tuckerman, Thompson Lee and Con Ganis in the Minor Triples. Both games were played in good spirit.

The Challenge Cup for 2012 between West Pennant Hills and Pennant Hills has been held. Unfortunately, WPH lost by a margin of eight points. Of the 330 ends played on the day to have an eight point margin separating both clubs was a credit to all bowlers. From comments received, everybody enjoyed the day. As WPH will be hosting the event in 2013, we will be in a position to exact revenge. It has been agreed that the clubs will meet shortly to consider if there needs to be any alterations to the format. One suggestion that the committee may like to consider is to play the Challenge Cup over 21 ends as a half day event instead of a full day and maybe on a Saturday after the Pennant Season has finished. This will allow those bowlers who work during the week to have an opportunity to play. The suggestion has merit; however we do not want to get away from the current position that all bowlers have a right to participate regardless of grade.

Plans for the Open Day are proceeding. It has been agreed with the Sports Club, the Open Day will be held on Sunday 14 October 2012. The brochures to be used have been agreed upon and the format has been set in place. The coaching (accreditation course) has been completed by Michael Beaumont of the RNSWBA. We now have four men and two women bowlers who are in a position to undertake basic coaching of new or perspective bowlers prior to full coaching being undertaken by a club coach. There is a lot more planning to be completed over the coming months, therefore support from all bowlers male and female will be required if the Open Day is to be successful.

Currently, a Questionnaire is being circulated amongst the bowlers to provide answers to a number of issues that have been raised. Names are not to be supplied. Warren Phillips and Max Walters have put a lot of time and effort into the Questionnaire and hopefully the answers provided will be of benefit into decisions made relating to the future direction of the club.

The Koala Carnival is not far away. The Ladies is being held on Monday 30 April and the Men on Friday 4 May. Bill Austin – Homeway First National is sponsoring both events. Bill will also be providing a BBQ to the value of \$500 which is to be raffled. Volunteers will be required both ladies and men to sell tickets to the Sports Club patrons. This has been raised with the ladies. This is a perfect opportunity to make some money for both sections.

As this will be the last meeting before Easter, I would like to wish everybody as well as your families a safe and happy Easter.

Dear Treasurer Steve,

The accounts you have kept are in good order and no material issues are apparent that require any follow up.

I have only verified the <u>cash revenue items</u> (banking slips) of Green Fees & Raffle Receipts and Locker hire fees for the period to 7<sup>th</sup> January 2012 (refer Main Club's tranaction sheet batch No.75)...together with spot checks of several other sundry items which were received and/or paid for during this period where documentation was available.

May I suggest that when the Friday bowls jackpot "goes off" that a record of the <u>amount paid out</u> and to whom and when it occurred would be advantageous as a record. Refer Batch No.45 dated 1.11.2011 where \$150 was won....no details of whom the recipients were.

Also any deposits that are apportioned between the Men & Womens bowls sections be noted and the <u>allocation noted</u>, for instance in the case of the Koala Carnival, on the banking deposit slip. Similarly in the case of any invoices apportioned..eg. Ad-vantage Bowls Supplies for the stickers etc. This was done and it is clear cut for anyone looking at the figures shown as to how it was derived. Well done!

It maybe prudent, that perhaps when no bowls is played due to wet weather etc. on any given day that a slip of paper (or revenue voucher) for that date be filed so that a <u>complete chronological sequence</u> be maintained and therefore no likelihood of a missing revenue voucher be an issue...just to cover oneself.

It is noted that the Charity Box donations are transferred to the Main club for action at a later date and are not reflected in the MBC accounts. Mention of this item is made for the benefit of anyone perusing the banking slips are wondering where the donations are shown in the accounts.

As the bulk of the creditors payments are made by the main Sports Club these <u>material</u> <u>items</u> will no doubt be scrutinise & verified by the Club's <u>external auditors</u> at year end...eg. Greens Contracting fees, Affiliation fees, Shirts stock purchases etc.

Keep up the good work Steve!
