#### 4.8 Competition Selection Panel

- 1) Most of the potential Pennant players have started on their 48-bowl test.
- 2) The Panel is preparing exercises to help the bowlers train for their possible position in a team.
- 3) The following external trial matches have been arranged :
  - a. February 22, versus Asquith all three grades
  - b. March 1, versus Castle Hill grade 6 only
- 4) The Panel recommends that three teams be entered in the 2014 Pennant season. It further recommends that WPH applies for teams in grades 4, 5, and 6. This recommendation to change the present grade 5 to grade 4 is based on:
  - a. The loss of grade 3 players after last season
  - b. Easier to rotate players between grades as needed.

#### 4.11 Greens

Work on the top green is proceeding to plan. Over the last few days, the plinths have been relayed and some plugging has taken place. The plugs have been taken from the ditches as there is plenty of grass available for what is required. Two further rub ins have occurred with the most recent taking place on Wednesday 29 January. A further rub in may be necessary but if required it will only be a light application. The ditches will be prepared in the near future. At this time the plan is to have the green back in play by the end of February early March. Ross and Steve are monitoring the progress of the green on a regular basis.

The recent rain, although we need more has helped to re-invigorate the bottom green. Brown patches were appearing but this was not caused by the lack of water. Due to the hot days parts of the green ceased growing and it became a matter of waiting for the conditions to change. WPH was not the only club experiencing the problem. It is well known that the green is not running as fast as some would like it to be and also the bowls are jumping at times. The reasons for this have been explained to the bowlers on a number of occasions; however it seems some like to highlight the fact on a regular basis. This will be addressed in due course. If the bottom green is cut close to the surface now and is rolled heavily, expect to see a green in very poor condition at the end of winter. It is accepted there is frustration at the moment but this green is going to be in play longer than normally required. In essence, the green keepers have done an excellent job considering the work required on the top green.

The ditch witch has been used on the bank of the Western side of the top green. Hopefully, this will have broken up some the roots of the gum trees so growth on that side of the green is not hampered. Actually, growth on that side of the green has been good even without the use of the ditch witch. A lot of roots were removed when the surface of the old green was removed.

The shades on the Northern side of the bottom green are to be replaced. The Board has agreed for this to occur. I would like to thank the Board for their support on the matter. It is very much appreciated. A few weeks will elapse before they are replaced. The shades can still be used but bowlers need to be careful when using them and making sure they are rolled back after use.
