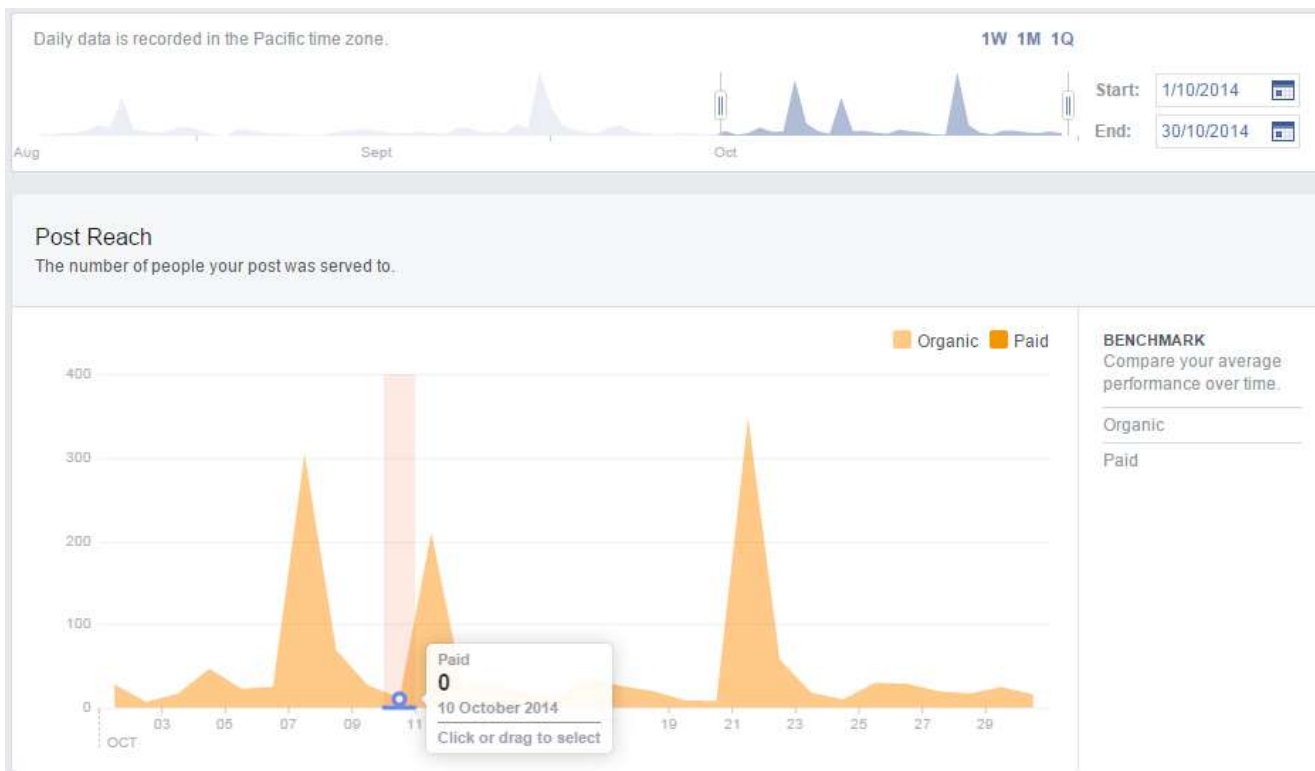
Currently evaluating alternate calendars for the website which will allow better viewing of events and allow activity owners (bowls co-ordinators, umpires...) direct access to add/edit events.

1.8 Greens Committee

Work on the bottom green has been completed. It is now a matter of watching the grass grow over the next couple of months and hoping the weather will be kind. For the next week or so, the sprinklers will be used day and night. A note has been sent to Jason advising that there is the possibility that club patrons may get wet and suggesting warning signs be erected. Jason has acknowledged the suggestion.

The green has been laser levelled and hopefully the hill on the Western side has been removed. An inspection of the North Western side was completed. Nothing untoward was noted so it seems the dampness in that area during winter is due to lack of sunlight. A water leak has been discovered at

the sprinkler head near the flag pole on the top green. Jason has been advised. There is a possibility that it is a slow leak and it has only recently been discovered as the sprinklers are being used more often.

A request has been received from Steve that if the top green has been set to run North/South any roll ups be East/West on the marker pegs. This has been done to reduce wear. The reverse will apply if the green is set to run East/West. A note will be placed on the blackboard; therefore it is responsibility of the bowlers to check each day. If bowlers choose to ignore the request, then the only solution is to limit roll ups. Steve has also requested that bowlers refrain from standing on the edges of the green. This will also help to reduce wear. Before bowling commences each day, the bowlers need to be notified.

As the top green has been brought back into play earlier than normal, there is the possibility that if the weather is wet play may be limited to six rinks until the ditch rinks dry. Let us not panic! The green is capable of taking seven rinks provided it is look after. It is a possibility only and normal game day requirements should apply unless the weather intervenes. If it does occur, then the selectors/match committee may need to deal with any requirements.

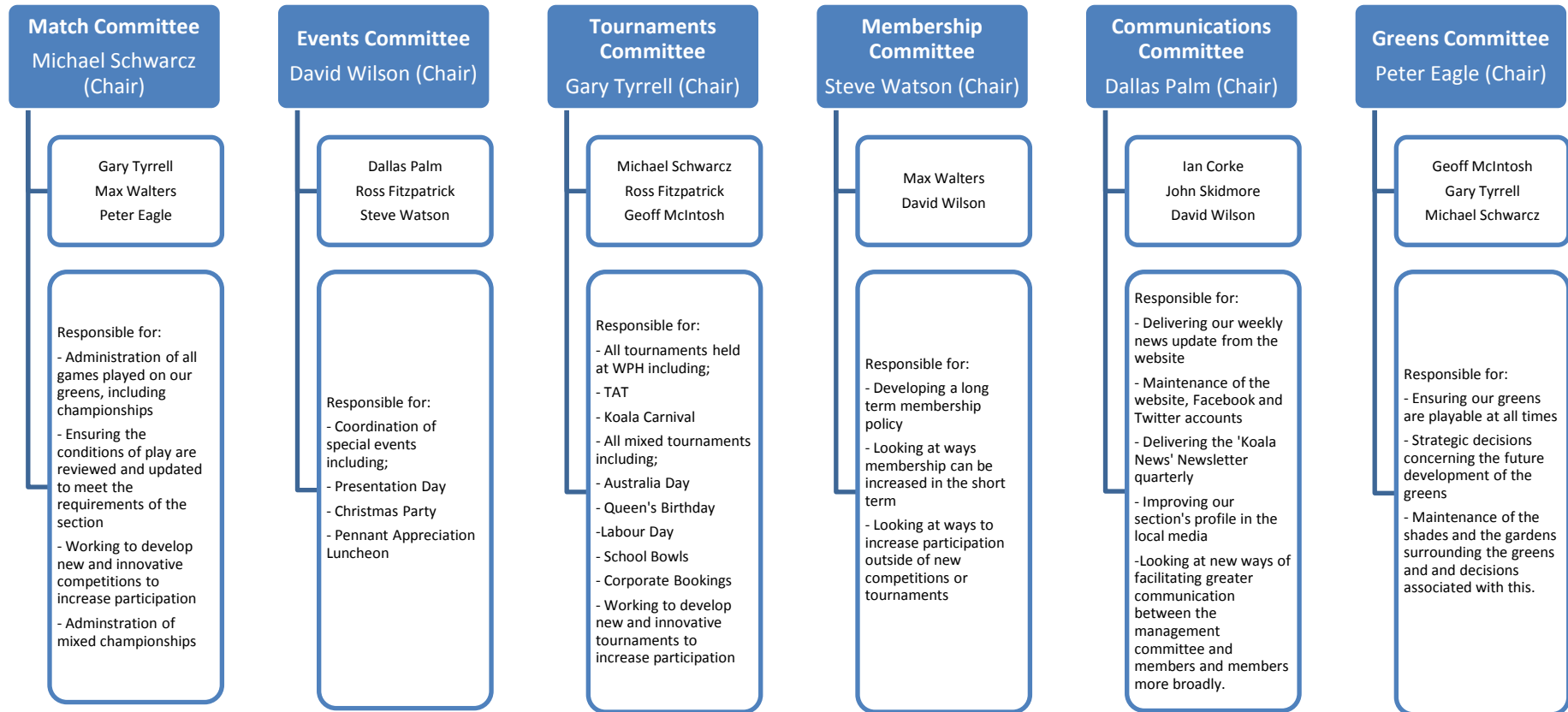
