The Bedford Trophy



2008 is the inaugural year of the Bedford Trophy, an new and highly prestigious award within the club. To be run on Saturdays in place of social bowls for those players not involved with Pennants, the Bedford Trophy offers an opportunity for players who enjoy a more structured competition during the regular Pennant season. Points are awarded for

- Participation / round = 10 points
- Game win / round = 10 points
- End won / game = 1 point each end

Should two or more players finish on equal points then the following count back system will apply :

- Player who has higher participation point tally shall be declared the winner.
- Should participation points be equal then player who has higher games points shall be declared the winner.
- Should players still be equal then total end points / per game, starting with the last completed round and working backward, until a winner is decided.

AN EARLY HISTORY OF THE CLUB AND THE FORMATION OF THE MENS AND WOMENS BOWLING CLUBS (1967-71) - PART ONE

The West Pennant Hills Bowling and Recreation Club (1967-1997) now the West Pennant Hills Sports Club developed from a failed attempt to form a club, the Hills Club Limited, to be located in the Pennant Hills area. In 1964 a change of committee brought a change of direction to a family oriented Recreation Club to be located in West Pennant Hills.

During the period 1965 through 1967 several earlier established key objectives had to be met if the project was to succeed:-

- Develop a membership level of at least 200, preferred level 300.
- Build members funds to at least \$30,000 (a lot of cash at 1965/68 values).
- Purchase a suitable site, initial specifications being at least 3 acres, 5 acres preferred, conveniently located in West Pennant Hills and affordable.
- Arrange regular social and sporting events to demonstrate a community need for a Licensed Club in West Pennant Hills.
- Lodge a successful application to the Licensing Court for a conditional license, this being a major consideration to support any application for finance for the project.
- Establish an active bowling group of men and women bowlers within the club as active sections of the Club, Organisational Structure of the Proposed Club

The proposed structure of a Licensed Club to support a range of recreational activities operating as sections within the Licensed Club was a significant change to the accepted organisation of sporting clubs in the 1960's, particularly bowling clubs.

The fact that we proposed that all members male and female, irrespective of membership status, would be eligible for election to the Board and to vote at Annual and General Meetings, was quite a radical departure to the established practice and custom in most sporting clubs oriented to non voting male social members or lady associate members. In general, bowling clubs were male only, women bowlers usually confined to playing at women's bowling clubs. A typical local example at that time being the Pennant Hills Central Women's Bowling Club with a bowling green located in Boundary Road, Pennant Hills. The members of this Club eventually joined the Pennant Hills Bowling Club; this being the general trend for women's bowling clubs during the mid to late 1970's.

The proposed structure of our Club did attract local media attention and including one Sydney newspaper as being a club with a different approach. Some significant events associated with the early history of the licensed club need to be recorded at this stage.

The Umpires Corner - Don Couch

I note from the Editor's letter in the first edition that this newsletter will provide information on changes to the laws of the game. Thanks to the confusion created by the Royal in regard to the minimum length of the rolling of the jack and whether the mat can be handed to the opponent by the winner of the previous end, I would remind all players that the minimum length is 23m and the mat can be handed over to an opponent as stated in the Crystal Mark laws of the Sport of Bowls.

Corporate Bowls

This is an avenue for fundraising suitable for groups such as Employer/Employee functions, Birthday Parties and other special events. The Men's Bowling Sections gets credited with any income received. If you know of any interested organizations or people, please let me know. When these events are held, and depending on the number of people involved, it is desirable to have some assistance to explain bowling practice and OH and S requirements. I hope I can count on your support.
