AN EARLY HISTORY OF THE CLUB AND THE FORMATION OF THE MENS AND WOMENS BOWLING CLUBS (1967-71) - PART THREE

Purchase of 103 New Line Road

Many prospective sites were investigated by a Board sub-committee, mostly either inappropriately located or beyond the Club's financial capacity. Eventually the late Keith Walkom, Club President at the time, came up with the 103 New Line Road site.

There were some misgivings from some committee members because of the creek on the southern boundary and which crossed the property towards New Line Road. It should be pointed out that in 1968 the current Club site was surrounded by undeveloped land,

Cherrybrook as we know it today did not exist. The vendor agreed to negotiate directly with the Club but had indicated an asking price which was beyond the Club's financial capacity at that time. The then Committee Executive met with the vendor at the President's residence and eventually arrived at an agreed purchase price of \$39,000. Then there was the problem of how to finance the purchase, available Club funds were limited to about \$22,000 plus a promised loan of \$10,000 from the C.B.C. Bank.

This was inadequate, the vendor eventually agreed to accept second mortgage status for \$8,500 loan to the Club, with some provisos, one being that the purchase was approved by the members.

The purchase of 103 New Line Road was confirmed at a general meeting of members held on 8th May, 1968.

Formation of Bowling Sections

As the Club progressed towards lodging an application for a conditional liquor license, legal advice at the time was for the Club to have men and women bowling groups operating as active sections of the Club to support the application. At this time bowling clubs were having more success with license applications than other social and recreational clubs, which explains the advice at the time for the Club name finally adopted to include bowling in the name; an earlier preferred name was West Pennant Hills Recreation Club.

In January 1969 the Board resolved to proceed with the formation of two bowling sections and appointed a board member to initiate the formation of the proposed sections and later to act as the Liaison Director. Initially all members of the Club were contacted by circular promoting the proposed bowling sections and seeking expressions of interest. The response was disappointing only 12 men and 5 ladies indicated interest.
