# An Early History Of The Club And The Formation Of The Mens And Womens Bowling Clubs (1967-71) - Part Five

#### Financing the Project

Financing the initial project was to be quite an exercise. An early problem being that the vendor of the land became concerned about his second mortgage status and the Club's borrowings and withdrew his support. The lending bank the then Bank of N.S.W. responded to the Club's problem, increased the bank loan and the vendor was paid out. The Club was fortunate to have a prominent local identity and a strong supporter of the Club as the then Manager of the Pennant Hills Branch, supported by some helpful contacts at the head office of the bank and Hornsby Council agreeing to a loan of \$10,000. The Club's borrowing position at January, 1971, and prior to any revenue from trading was \$79 648, in addition to members unsecured non-interest bearing loans totalling \$38 511.

#### **Stage 1 Construction**

Kell and Rigby were the successful in their tender for the building work on a design and construct basis, the tenders included site clearing, access roads, bridge over the creek, club house and site preparation for bowling green and tennis courts; construction work commenced on 3rd August, 1970 and was completed on 31st December, 1970,

### No .l Bowling Green

There were four tenders for the construction of the bowling green, the broad specification being the preparation of the base and drainage, supply all materials, grass and bring to the final level, contract price \$9,250.(the second bowling green built in 1989 cost in excess of \$100,000.) Construction of the bowling green was completed during January 1971. It was the general practice at this time for clubs to employ greenkeepers rather than the contract system which generally operates today. The first greenkeeper commenced employment on 13th January, 1971, at the then award rate of \$65 per week, which included Saturday morning work. The current award rate for greenkeepers on similar conditions is \$520 per week.

#### License Approval

The conditional license granted on 15th May, 1970 was conditional on the Club being able to both finance and complete all building work included in the application. An unusual feature of the conditional license decision was that the whole of the site would be licensed. The reason for this being to ensure that the Club would complete all facilities included in the application. Thus began a series of court appearances commencing on 11th January through early March. A very zealous Licensing Sergeant found many reasons for deferment such as tennis court fencing not complete, bowling green not ready for play, club house not operational, the license was eventually granted on 1st March and the Club commenced trading on 8th March, 1971.

#### Opening of Club

The official opening of the Club on the 8th May, 1971 was performed by the late Max Ruddock, M.L.A., the then Member for The Hills electorate; the electorate in which the Club was then located. The choice of Max Ruddock to officially open the Club was very appropriate he had been an enthusiastic supporter of the Club during the formative years, attended many of our early public meetings and also was at the Licensing Court to support the Club's license application.

#### Opening of Bowling Green and the First President's Day

The opening of the bowling green was on 3rd April 1971; the formal opening was combined with a President's Day for the first President of the Men's Bowling Club, Gordon Atkins. The official opening of the bowling green, postponed several times due to unfavourable weather or unavailability of people, was performed by the then President of the Royal N.S.W. Bowling Association, N.K. Braddock, on 18th Dec. 1971.
