SELECTOR'S UPDATE - ALAN BOWRY

Pennants 2010

Following the enthusiastic response from our Bowlers to play Pennants for our Club in 2010 and in view of that number of Bowlers, herewith the current situation:

There are now 53 Bowlers who have now committed to play Pennants, together with 8 additional Bowlers who will be available to fill in when an emergency arises throughout the season. A total of 61 Bowlers which should suffice the required number to support 4 Sides.

In view of this number of players available the selectors have applied for and been accepted into 4 Sides in 2010 Pennants i.e. Grades --- 3, 5, 6, 7

The opportunity of having 4 Sides is so important in the development of our new Bowlers and those players who have never had that chance to play in such a prestige competition as Pennants, which will only benefit to our Club in the short and long term.

It is critical to emphasis the importance of team solidarity with teams selected not only on performance and skill but over cohesiveness.

Joe Bedford Cup

Once again this year, the Joe Bedford Cup competition will be run for those members not taking part in the Pennants competition. To be run on Saturdays in place of social bowls for those players not involved with Pennants, the Bedford Cup offers an opportunity for players who enjoy a more structured competition during the regular Pennant season.

Points are awarded for

- Participation / round = 10 points
- Game win / round = 10 points
- End won / game = 1 point each end

Should two or more players finish on equal points then the following count back system will apply:

- Player who has higher participation point tally shall be declared the winner.
- Should participation points be equal then player who has higher games points shall be declared the winner.
- Should players still be equal then total end points / per game, starting with the last completed round and working backward, until a winner is decided.

Other than that, I would like to wish everyone a great year of bowls this year.

MATCH COMMITTEE UPDATE - DAVID WILSON

Inclement Weather

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all members on behalf of the Match Committee for their co-operation over the last few weeks. Whether it has been due to extreme rain or extreme heat, everyone has been most compliant with the direction given by the Controlling Body with regard to play. As always, the Match Committee is open to suggestions from our members. Your thoughts are welcome in helping us to refine our conditions of play to make bowls as enjoyable as possible while maintaining safety at all times.

With this in mind and with a run of extreme heat occurring over the next couple of weeks, I would ask that members use their common sense and exercise some responsibility for their own wellbeing. If you are a person who doesn't handle the heat well, please don't put your name down to play. While we welcome everyone to play as often as possible, it isn't fair to put pressure on the Controlling Body to act in your best interests. Sometimes we need individuals to make their own decision based on their health. Furthermore, while no-one thinks any less of anyone for pulling out of bowls due to extreme weather, please inform the selectors as soon as possible to avoid any problems with regard to numbers in organised competitions.

The Match Committee is in the process of refining the extreme heat sub-section of the Conditions of Play. My personal thanks to Steve Brady for his assistance in this matter, especially in making representations to the main club's board on our behalf.

Uniform

With the pennant season fast approaching, the Zone Match Committee has asked all clubs to remind those participating in pennants to be mindful of their uniform.

For pennant competition;

<u>SHIRT</u>: The club's turquoise and maroon shirt with the Bowls Australia logo must be worn. The old cream club shirt or any other white or cream shirt is not acceptable for pennants. Anyone wearing any other shirt will be asked to change shirts before play starts. (Note however, that shirts no longer need to be tucked-in to the trousers)

<u>PANTS</u>: Both shorts and long trousers are acceptable.

<u>SHOES</u>: Shoes must be all white or predominantly white with no other colours on them. The only exceptions are maker's logos as long as they are tonal. Shoes where the sole extends up the sides of the shoe are not acceptable.

<u>SOCKS</u>: Plain white socks/sockettes/ankle socks are all permitted.

Please note that the same requirements apply for club championships. If you arrive at the club for a club championship match in a shirt other than the club's turquoise and maroon shirt will be asked to change before the match can commence.

Roll-ups

To ensure the longevity of our greens between renovations and over the hectic competition season, the Management Committee is asking all members who roll-up to roll-up on the boundary markers. This should help the green wear evenly and avoid runners appearing in the green. Our greenkeeper Blake has marked the boundary markers with white or blue dots so that members are able to see where the lines are.

Championship Conditions of Play

I would like to remind everyone of the importance of reading the individual conditions of play for championship events. Most importantly, the scheduled dates are pretty well set in stone owing to the packed championship calendar we have this year. Already, the Match Committee has had to knock back several requests for changes in the scheduled time of championship because alternate times are not available. However, those with exceptional circumstances should receive dispensation. It is a situation which while being regrettable is nonetheless necessary.

I would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year and happy and safe bowling over the next 12 months.
