

A little nostalgia for those that can remember (or forgotten) the changes that have occurred in the growth of our Club and for the newer members who may be interested.

At the Foundation meeting of the Club in 1967 there were 244 members who met at Pennant Hills High School. The land was purchased in 1968. (Cherrybrook as we know it did not exist then). By 1969 both men's and women's bowling sections were identifiable groups, but membership was disappointing when only 12 men and 5 women expressed interest in bowling. The Club and the bottom green were constructed in 1970 and because there was only one green, players had to play at adjoining Clubs for the 6-8 weeks for the annual renovation. It was obvious a second green was required but finances restricted its construction with the cost blowing out to \$100,000. However due to sponsorships, loans from members and raffles, the second green was opened in 1989.

Today the Registered Club has approximately 10,200 members of which 180 are registered bowlers.

Zone 10 has invited bowlers from Clubs in the over 60 age group who have not played for Zone in the past, to try out for team selection. WPH has taken up the challenge and will be sending 3 bowlers. The experience will be of benefit and hopefully success will be the outcome.

In 2012, we will have our new uniforms. A lot of time and effort has been put into completing the requirements and I wish to thank everybody who has had involvement with the project. The uniforms with the return of the Koala on the shirts, jackets and caps is nearing completion. The shirts will be arriving shortly, with caps and jackets to follow.

I would like to commend the use of the Club website to all bowlers. The website provides information on what is happening around the Club. . . green updates, competitions internal and external, results, photos and matters of interest are supplied so bowlers are able to keep themselves up-to-date on what is happening. Betty was born in 1928 at Beerwah on the Sunshine Coast Qld, where she lived until she was 2yrs old.

The family moved to Brisbane where she attended Kedron State School, when *chalk and a slate board* were required for writing!!

She always enjoyed sport and choir singing, and can remember only one occasion being sent to the Headmasters Office for answering back.

Betty's 1st job was at a Brisbane Department store. However she was very fond of ballroom dancing, and when Betty, her sister and friends attended, they were chaperoned by their mothers. . . can you believe that!

During the 'War Years' with an influx of troops stationed in Brissy, she met the 'love of her life' Jim, in 1944. Sadly, Jim was then sent to Borneo till 1947.

Jim lived with his parents at Rhodes NSW, and upon returning from the war, they were married. Due to the housing shortage then, they moved in with Betty's in-laws. They eventually built a home at Ermington, where they lived for 36 years and had 2 daughters. Family life was wonderful, with a great deal of it involved with the Uniting Church and Fellowship (which was their main social outlet). Betty always tried to have a productive, useful life such as cooking, dressmaking (or whatever needed to done), etc. Her parents had always said 'if a jobs worth doing . . . do it well!' (Apparently Betty tried, but the results aren't in yet . . . editor).

Betty's daughters have married great guys and delivered her 4 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren.

Betty's father-in-law encouraged both Jim (later becoming a Life Member of Denistone) and her to play bowls in 1986 at Parramatta RSL Club. They had many great times and bowling successes along the way.

They both travelled overseas, visiting USA (several times), England, Scotland, Ireland and NZ.

Jim became ill in 1992 upon moving to W P Hills to be near family, where he passed away in 1993. She then joined 'Legacy' (Eastwood), devoting many years helping out when needed. ('It was always fun being a model at their fashion parades' she said).

Betty has been on our ladies bowls committee for 23 yrs in one form or another, feeling privileged to have done so, with great times and friendships made. Her only claim to fame is 'being a good helper' and with my grandsons' reckoning 'I'm the best Nan on the Planet!' Remember, you only get out of life what you are prepared to put into it. Steve Brady



Steve and his wife Pat were born in Barrow-In Furness in the North West of England.

Barrow-In-Furness is a small industrial town just 14 miles from the beautiful English Lakes District. Barrow is a ship building town, mainly building submarines and aircraft carriers. Subsequently during WW2, it received many numerous 'unfriendly' visits from the German Luftwaffe bomber raids, which destroyed large areas of the town.

In 1958 they emigrated to the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland. Little did they know that major political problems were forming in parts of Africa that would eventually change their lives for ever.

On arrival in Salisbury Rhodesia, they found it to be an exciting place and quickly settled in to the much faster pace of life. Steve worked on the electrical installations of multi-story buildings and Pat worked as a florist.

In 1959 Steve was offered a well-paid position in Nyasaland (now Malawi). He never stopped to think why, until arriving in Blantyre, the capital. He soon found out that Nyasaland was in a 'state of emergency' with looting and rioting all over the country, so he subsequently ended-up volunteering for the British Colonial Police reserve, serving as an inspector for a total of 3 years.

They left Nyasaland in 1963 and returned to Southern Rhodesia. Steve took up a senior position as technical services manager with the Meikles Hotel Group, which consisted of 17 Hotels (Town, Country and Safari) 2 of which were totally destroyed by artillery and RPG rocket attacks during the war. In 1996 hostilities commenced in Rhodesia with farmers and their families being brutally murdered by Communist trained terrorists. In 1973 when the war was reaching its peak, he was conscripted into the Rhodesian Army reserve, where as reservists they saw plenty of action and he served until the end of war in 1980. They served on a roster basis of 6 weeks in and 6 weeks out. In 1981, with President Mugabe now in control, they left Rhodesia with a only a maximum of \$1000 allowance per family allowed out of the country. Subsequently the Bradys' headed to Saudi Arabia, where Steve worked for over two years to make some quick money.

In November 1985 they immigrated to Australia where Steve took up a position as Director of Engineering with the Southern Pacific Hotel Corporation. This position entailed covering the whole of Australia, NZ, Asia, all the South Pacific Islands and India.

Rest of the World takes bowls Ashes

Ashes for the second time at Ourimbah Lisarow RSL Bowling Club's Australia v Rest of the World challenge.

A discussion has recently come up

with some male bowlers, whether raffles are the way to go, to generate interest (and revenue) after bowls.

Firstly a guess has to be made beforehand, what the weather and number of players will be, before meat trays can be ordered. Then people need to be allocated, volunteer or be drawn, to assist in raffle ticket sales. Then if a day is cancelled due to weather, the meat trays are sold possibly at cost/or a loss.

An easier alternative may be the option of paying the same amount that would normally be paid (\$5), but prizes could be possibly Club Vouchers or Wine, instead of Meat Raffles. However with a 'Lucky' rink (or another criteria), the players on the 'winning' rink would win Club Vouchers or Wine.

An example would be on any given day when we have say 30 bowlers. All bowlers pay \$5 each, therefore income is 30x\$5=\$150. If 50% was taken for profit, that would leave a \$75 (or an even amount) dividend to be distributed in one form or another to the 'chosen' rink players.

Those players who currently **do not** buy Raffle Tickets may possibly now decide to participate in this different form.... Who Knows? Editor

Navigating the Blog

Navigating the Blog is quite simple. Immediately below the Blog title 'Bowlers Blog' is a menu of pages of content for specific areas such as: About, Greens Update, Who's online?, Contact Us.

Selecting the heading will load the corresponding page.

Next in the centre of the page are the 'articles' or 'Posts' that have been put on the Blog. These are arranged with the latest at the top of the page. Try scrolling the page down to read older articles.

When you 'click' on the red **read more** button, it then opens up the whole article.

Recent Comments

This heading is top right of your screen and is a listing of the 5 most recent comments on the Blog.

Advertising

There is an area where Advertising appears for products or services in which you may have an interest. The site may obtain commission for sales through these ads.

However to make comments to existing articles or add to your own articles on the Bowlers Blog you will need to Register as a User. To do this select **Register** button in the **Meta** block on right of screen. Provided there are no errors, you will be emailed a confirmation email to complete the registration. Open the email and follow the steps in the email to finish the registration process.

Why all this rigmarole? Because we do not want hackers or undesirables entering and messing around with our site. Therefore the necessity to have you registered before having access to adding to the site.

It is hoped that with a little patience you will ava go and navigate the website successfully. Just remember that you view the site without registering, but if you wish to contribute then registration is essential.
